- b. The Bible is very clear about supporting those that are central in the teaching ministries of the church. Those of us who are taught the Word of God by a teacher, should in turn support the teacher by any and all material and immaterial means. Luke 10:7, 1 Cor 9:11
 - i. *Abuse of these principles*: ministerial laziness & congregational control
- 4. Verse 8 How we will eventually
 - a. 8 For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life.
 - i. Paul moves from the <u>particular</u> to the <u>general</u>, from *Christian ministers* and their support to *Christian people* and their moral behavior.
 - b. 2 Types of sowing with corresponding results:
 - i. Sowing in the <u>flesh</u> = reaping <u>corruption</u> How do we do this?
 - (1) **Works of the flesh** go back to 5:16-25 we pander to desires, giving in to them instead of fighting them; we harbor grudges, nurse a grievance, entertain impure fantasy not grounded in reality or wallow in self pity.
 - ii. Sowing in the <u>Spirit</u> = reaping <u>eternal life</u> How?
 - (1) **Keep in step with the Spirit** 'set our mind on the Spirit', But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law; we submit to God's Word and foster spiritual disciplines that will "build" in the Spirit; missions involvement, prayer, learning Scripture, giving of yourself and your offerings..etc.
- 5. Verses 9-10 We sow first to our then all
 - a. 9 And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up. So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith.
 - i. Do not grow weary of doing good...why? In due season we will **reap**, if we do not give up...which happens all the time.
 - b. First strive to continue to sow spiritually into our families
 - c. <u>Second</u> strive to continue to sow spiritually to everyone
 - i. **James 5:7** Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains.
