- 1. <u>Remember the purpose of John's gospel</u> John 20:30-31 Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; 31 but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.
- 2. John's Uniqueness as compared to the synoptics:
 - a. <u>Matthew</u> (28 chaps, longest) begins with a genealogy/family tree
 - i. Verses 1 Shows his ______- Christ, the Son of David (David who?...King David of Israel) the son of Abraham.
 - ii. Verses 2-17 Begins with Abraham...ends with...Joseph (even though Joseph was not the biological father of Jesus.
 - (1) From Abraham forward to Jesus Christ, showing that Jesus was indeed the ______ of the Jews.
 - b. Mark (16 chaps, shortest) has no genealogy
 - i. Begins with John the Baptist's ministry [quote from Isaiah] to "prepare the way" for Christ;
 - (1) Mark 10:45 For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."
 - iii. <u>Luke</u> (24 chaps) Begins with early introductory information about John the Baptist and Jesus and how they were related - the aspect of both of their births.
 - i. After Jesus is baptized by John, a genealogy is presented in the text:
 - ii. 3:23-38 Begins with...Joseph...ends with the son of Seth, the son of Adam, the son of God.
 - (1) From Joseph backwards to Adam [show _____
 - d. John (20 chaps) begins "in the beginning," before time began [show _____]
 - i. John shows Christ as the pre-incarnate Word existing with God the Father before time began.
- 3. What is different in John? [not all inclusive]
 - a. <u>Christ's Divinity</u> In the initial verses, the synoptics present Jesus as a historical figure and move toward his divinity....but John begins in his initial verses by stressing the deity of Jesus <u>full deity</u>. Christ is part of the ______ from the very beginning.
 - b. <u>Uniqueness in vocabulary:</u> the key word in the book is the verb *"believe"* (pisteuo), which appears ______ times; the noun form of the word (pistes, faith) does not occur at all; we also hear witness,

love, abide, the Counselor, Holy Spirit, light, life, darkness, Word, glorify, true/truth and real.

- 4. <u>Omissions & Differences</u> John omitted several things that are troubling to many:
 - a. Jesus' genealogy, his miraculous birth in Bethlehem, temptation, exorcizing demons, parables (40), the sermon on the mount, the transfiguration, institution of the Lord's Supper, agony in Gethsemane and ascension.
 - b. Descriptions of Jesus' baptism and the calling of the 12, listing them by name.
 - c. The ______ cleansing is at the beginning of John's gospel, in the synoptics it was after the triumphant entry on Palm Sunday (Mark 11, Matt 21, Luke 19]
- 5. <u>Geography</u> In the synoptics Christ spends most of his time in and around _______ and makes one trip to Jerusalem, just a week before his death. According to John, Jesus makes four trips to Jerusalem (2:13, 5:1, 7:10, 12:12) and spend a significant part of his ministry in Judea.
- 6. <u>Content</u> About ______ of the material in John's gospel does not appear in the synoptics; it seems that John was writing a work that would "______" the other gospels instead of replacing them,

bearing witness to certain events that were not in the synoptics.

- a. Chapters 2-4, including Christ's miraculous transformation of water into wine, his talk with Nicodemus, his ministry in Samaria.
- b. No record of the institution of the Lord's supper, instead we have the _____; the resurrection of Lazarus
- 7. <u>Writing Style</u> Jesus teaches in sets of pairs "_____ opposites" - life/death, from above/below, light/dark, truth/lie, sight/blindness
- 8. <u>The seven "I AM" statements</u> Where Christ ascribes to himself divinity but using the "I AM" statement from <u>Exodus 3:14</u> God said to Moses, "I am who I am." And he said, "Say this to the people of Israel, 'I am has sent me to you.'
 - a. 6:35 "I am the bread of <u>life</u>"...8:12, "I am the light of the world"... 10:7, "I am the door of the sheep"...10:9, "I am the door"...10:11, "I am the good shepherd"...10:14, "I am the <u>good</u> shepherd"...11:25, I am the resurrection and the life"...14:6, "I am the <u>way</u> and the truth and the life"...15:1, "I am the true <u>vine</u>; you are the branches"...15:5, "I am the vine"
- 9. The seven signs
 - a. 1) changing *water into wine* 2:1-11; 2) Healing the *official's son* 4:36-54; 3) healing the *paralytic* 5:1-9; 4) feeding the *5,000* 6:1-15; 5) walking on *water* 6:16-21; 6) healing a *man born blind* 9; 7) Raising *Lazarus* 11:1-44.
