	iii. Outward expression - speech or message - which is why
	"word" is one of the most agreed upon translations.
	iv. Personification of wisdom - Some scholars have suggested that Proverbs 8 that personifies wisdom can be related to what John is saying in his gospel. Read Proverbs 8

It is the Word of God that gives understanding to the prophets concerning the mind and will of God. This thought of God's illumination is developed and personified in the concept of 'wisdom', particularly in the book of Proverbs.
