1. Galatians 5:16-26

- a. EVIDENCE of WALKING in the Spirit
- b. 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. 24 And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.

2.	Scholarship	sees	three	categories	here:

- i. <u>Dispositions of the mind</u> love, joy, peace
- ii. <u>Qualities affecting human relationships</u> patience, kindness, goodness
- iii. <u>Principles that guide conduct</u> faithfulness, gentleness and self control
- b. This morning we will expound on LOVE
 - i. "It has often been said that love is the circulatory system of the body of Christ." *Warren Wiersbe*
- 3. Remember what Paul said already in his letter to the Galatians:
 - a. **Galatians 5:14** 14 For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall *love your neighbor as yourself.*"
- 4. Four Greek forms of love in Scripture filia, eros, apage, storge
 - a. **filia, storge** warm, intimate friendship, brotherly love, family love
 - b. **eros** physical love between sexes.
 - c. **agape** self sacrificial love exemplified by _____ on the cross.
- 5. The Most Excellent Way 1 Corinthians 12:31 13
 - a. 1 Corinthians 12:31-13:13
 - i. Love IS patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant 5 or rude.
 - i. <u>Patient</u> (attitude) [makrothumeo] to demonstrate patience despite ______.
 - ii. <u>kind</u> (action) [chresteuomai] to provide something beneficial for someone as an act of kindness

ii. Love IS NOT envious, boastful, arrogant or rude

- i. Envious [zeloo] a grudging regard for the advantages seen to be enjoyed by others strong desire to have someone else has.
- ii. <u>Boastful</u> [perpereuomai] talk with _____ pride and self-satisfaction about ones self; to brag.
- iii. Arrogant [physioo] having an exaggerated sense of one's own importance or abilities; haughtiness.

- iv. <u>Rude</u> [aschemoneo] offensively impolite or ill mannered; to act in defiance of social and moral standards, with resulting disgrace, embarrassment and shame.
- iii. Love DOES NOT insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; 6 it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth.
 - i. <u>Insist on its own way [zeteo] state</u> without accepting refusal or contradiction; Mark 8:11 miracle
 - ii. <u>Irritable or resentful</u> [paroxyno] annoyed or angered; [logizomai] feeling or expressing bitterness or indignation
 - iii. Rejoice at wrongdoing [adikia] unrighteousness; unjust deeds;

iv. Love DOES

- i. <u>Rejoice with the truth</u> [aletheia] the content of that which is true and thus in accordance with what really happened.
- v. 7 Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. [Hyperbole exaggerations to make a point]
 - i. <u>All things</u> = acceptable in God's righteousness and will, of everything within the Lord's divine tolerance.
 - ii. Bears all things [stego] to cover/carry; protect; love bears all things by ______ others from exposure, ridicule or harm; even when a sin is certain, love tries to correct it with the least possible hurt and harm to the guilty person; love does not expose, exploit, gloat or condemn. It bears, not bares.
 - iii. Believes all things [pisteuo] believe/trust; love is not

 or cynical; it believes in the best
 outcome for the one who has done the wrong; if there is a
 question about guilt or motivation, love will always opt for
 the most favorable possibility; if the person turns out to be
 guilty, love will give credit for the best motive.
 - iv. Hopes all things [elpizo] to hope/expect when belief in a loved one's goodness or repentance is ______, love still hopes; as long as their is life, love does not lose hope.
 - v. Endures all things [hypmeno] military term used of an army's holding a vital position at all costs. Every hardship and suffering was to be ______ in order to hold fast; to remain/stay/hold out.
- vi. Love <u>bears</u> what otherwise is <u>unbearable</u>; it <u>believes</u> what otherwise is <u>unbelievable</u>; it <u>hopes</u> in what otherwise is <u>hopeless</u>; and it <u>endures</u> when anything less than love would give up. After love <u>bears</u> it <u>believes</u>, after it believes it <u>hopes</u>, after it hopes it <u>endures</u>.
- b. 24 And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.
